DATE: Saturday April 15, 1882 **LOCATION:** Lake Macquarie Heads,

New South Wales. Australia.

NAME: Unknown

BACKGROUND

MOON PHASE: New Moon, April 18,

1882

ENVIRONMENT: Lake Macquarie it is the largest coastal salt water lake in Australia, and has a substantial opening to the sea.

NARRATIVE: A group of three or four men were fishing when one of them fell overboard. A little bantering passed between them, during which the man who had fallen in replied that he would swim ashore. Shortly after he took off his jacket it was believed a shark dragged him under and he was never seen again.

INJURY: Presumed fatal

SPECIES: Shark involvement was suspected but not confirmed.
