WEATHER: The sky was clear and the air temperature was 82°F.

MOON PHASE: First Quarter,

June 25, 1966

SEA CONDITIONS: The water was clear and the temperature was 60°F.

DISTANCE FROM SHORE:

100 feet

DEPTH OF WATER: One foot

TIME: 16h00

NARRATIVE: Hiksdal and a companion were clamming when they speared a large fish. They were headed for shore with the fish, dragging it through the shallows, when it slashed the boy's leg.

INJURY: Three lacerations on

right leg.

FIRST AID / TREATMENT: Hiksdal's companion brought him to Fisherman's Wharf on Brigantine Boulevard. From there he was taken by ambulance with a police escort to Atlantic City Hospital.

SPECIES INVOLVED: Unknown. Sandbar sharks are common in the area in late summerLocal authorities speculated that the water was too cold for sharks. Next day, at 07h30 four clammers spotted a a seven-foot, 200-pound pregnant sandbar shark, chased her onto a sandbar and killed her with an anchor and the oars from their 14-foot boat. As the shark died, she gave birth to 12 pups.
