ATTACKS ON DIVERS	
1920-3.	THREE JAPANESE DIVERS. Killed by sharks on Barrier Reef.
1923. 23rd November.	TWO KOEPANG ISLANDERS. Condon, W.A. Lat. 20° 02'S. Fatal. Disappeared whilst dry-shelling. Thought to have been taken by sharks. Half body of one found—no trace of the other.
1923. 16th October.	AMANO. Japanese pearl diver. Recovery. Arm completely severed, middle of humerus.
1926. 17th November.	NOMA. Native pearl diver. Recovery. Details not known. Arm injured.
1927.	DICK LAHOU. Pearl diver. Thursday Island. Lat. 10° 35'S. Recovery. Felt as if hit by a pillow, was sick all night.
1927. 8th April.	ESEROMI. Native pearl diver. Recovery. Injuries to leg.
