TIME: 17h00

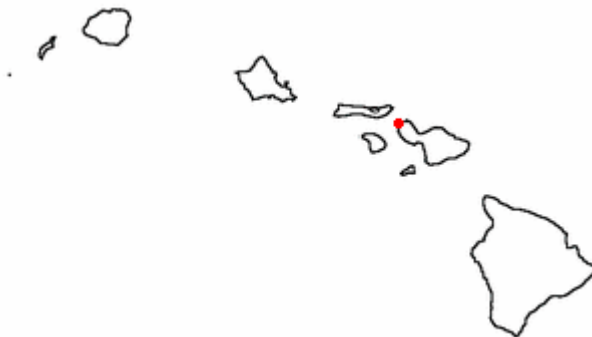

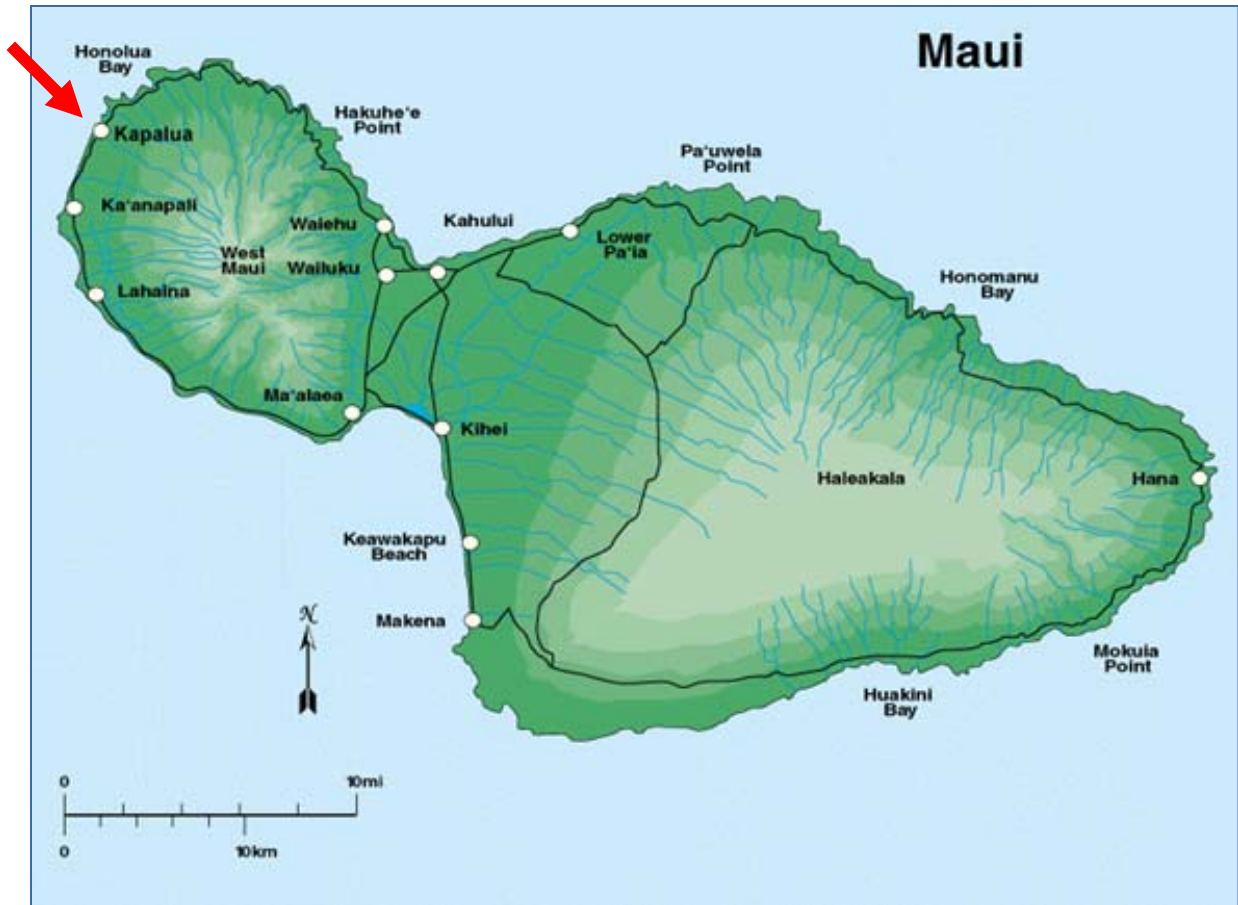
INJURY: No injury
