

ACTIVITY: Wading

DATE: Sunday July 9, 2006

LOCATION: The incident took place in the Atlantic Ocean near the New Smyrna Beach jetty, Volusia County, Florida, USA. 29.1°N, 81.0°W

NAME: Unknown

DESCRIPTION: He is a 40-year-old male, a tourist from Fayetteville, New York, on vacation with his family.

BACKGROUND

WEATHER: At 16h50, New Smyrna Beach recorded partly cloudy skies and visibility of 10 miles [16.1 km]. The air temperature was 82.4°F [28.0°C], dew point was 68.0°F [20.0°C], humidity 62%, sea level pressure 30.07 inches [1018.2 hPa] and wind direction was NNE at 13.8 mph [22.2 km/h].

MOON PHASE: Waxing Gibbous, 97% of the moon was illuminated.

DEPTH OF WATER: Waist-deep

TIME: Shortly after 5 p.m. [17h00]

NARRATIVE: No details.

INJURY: According to Beach Patrol Officer Michael Berard, the man had two small lacerations to the dorsum of his left foot.

FIRST AID / TREATMENT: No medical treatment was required.
