DATE: Saturday January 30, 2010

LOCATION: The accident took place in the South Atlantic Ocean near Tramandai, on the north coast of Rio Grande do Sul,

Brazil.

NAME: Andrei Johann

DESCRIPTION: He is a 29-year-old male,

a systems analyst from Porto Alegre.

BACKGROUND

MOON PHASE: Full Moon

ENVIRONMENT: The increase in sea temperature in the site may have attracted the animals, according to local experts.

DISTANCE FROM SHORE: 150 metres

NARRATIVE: Andrei Johann was sitting on his board when his foot was bitten.

INJURY: Lacerations to right foot.

FIRST AID / TREATMENT: He was taken to Hospital Santa Luzia in Capão da Canoa where the injury was repaired with 20 stitches, and he was discharged.

SPECIES: Santiago Montealegre, a shark specialist from the University of Rio Grande, believed the characteristics of the incident and the bite suggested that the accident involved a juvenile hammerhead shark.
