BACKGROUND

WEATHER: In Perth, the air temperature as 72°F, dew point 49°F, humidity 49%. sea level pressure 29.82 inches, and wind direction was West at 11 mph.

MOON PHASE: Waning Crescent, 30% of the Moon was illuminated. Last Quarter, April 22, 2014.

ENVIRONMENT: Coral Bay is located in Ningaloo Marine Park, and the waters around the bay and to the south are completely protected for several kilometres by the outer Ningaloo Reef. About 6 or 7km south from Monk's Head, just beyond of Five Fingers Reef, there's a 700-metre wide gap in the reef known as south passage.

DISTANCE FROM SHORE: Two kilometers

TIME: Afternoon

NARRATIVE: No details

NJURY: Minor

SPECIES: The WA Department of Fisheries believes a reef shark bit the man.
